	<ul> <li>One of the proposed changes involves reducing the requirement of the firm to have completed high complexity projects to qualify for high complexity work. The change being proposed will reduce this requirement to having completed 3 medium complexity projects. A similar change is proposed for the firm to have completed 3 low complexity projects to qualify for medium complexity work.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Another proposed change requires two key personnel to be registered for the high complexity</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>specialty. A two-year transition period is proposed.</li> <li>The remaining changes are to improve language by removing ambiguity and to provide clear</li> </ul>
